This position involves developing and executing strategy, direction, and donor cultivation for Keystone Symposia to garner endowed and annual gifts. This includes executing a comprehensive, integrated individual giving program with an emphasis on major and planned gifts and crafting a compelling case for support that creates meaningful opportunities for donors to invest in the Keystone Symposia's mission and grow contributions from individuals and family foundation donors and capital endowment campaigns.

The requirements for this position includes experience in executing a major individual donor program, success in building a major donor pipeline and proven track record in fostering professional relationships with high-net individuals. The applicant should have experience with overall donor relations and communications, and the demonstrated ability to influence and engage diverse audiences and to build long-term relationships, including experience leveraging executive-level staff and volunteers to achieve fundraising success.

Requirements:

The experience required for this position includes fundraising experience, including experience designing and implementing integrated individual giving programs. A Bachelor's degree is required. Experience in engaging with scientific thought leaders and researchers in the academic, biotechnology and pharmaceutical research sectors is strongly preferred. A successful candidate must have superior oral and written communications skills, including the ability to prepare proposals, reports, and related materials and the ability and willingness to travel.
